

1 Understanding the Call of The 72 – Where the Kingdom of God Reigns



➤ ***The Place of Provision***

- **Matthew 6:33 (ESV)** — ³³ But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

➤ ***The Place of Miracles***

- **Matthew 4:23 (ESV)** — ²³ And he went throughout all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction among the people.

➤ ***The Place of Victory***

- **Matthew 12:28 (ESV)** — ²⁸ But if it is by the Spirit of God that I cast out demons, then the kingdom of God has come upon you. (Also Luke 11:20)

➤ **The Place of Multiplication**

- **Matthew 21:42–43 (ESV)** — ⁴² Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the Scriptures: "'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; this was the Lord's doing, and it is marvelous in our eyes'? ⁴³ Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people producing its fruits.
- **Luke 6:38 (ESV)** — ³⁸ give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you."

2 **Kingdom Leaders**

- Leaders don't just accomplish a work or activity; they create the opportunity for others to move into a new reality of living in divine purpose.


3 **Discipleship—The Strategic Process of Purposeful Growth**

- **2 Timothy 2:1–7 (ESV)** — ¹ You then, my child, be strengthened by the grace that is in Christ Jesus, ² and what you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also. ³ Share in suffering as a good soldier of Christ Jesus. ⁴ No soldier gets entangled in civilian pursuits, since his aim is to please the one who enlisted him. ⁵ An athlete is not crowned unless he competes according to the rules. ⁶ It is the hard-working farmer who ought to have the first share of the crops. ⁷ Think over what I say, for the Lord will give you understanding in everything.

- Discipleship is a process of learning and growth in a **pressurized atmosphere**.



4 Kingdom Relationships—Multiplying Relationships

- Jesus' Approach
 - Jesus poured himself into those who could replicate and multiply what He carried.
 - Jesus created a pressurized atmosphere for Himself and those who followed Him.

- Jesus chose to fulfill His mission through intentional relationship building.



- Levels of Purposeful Relationship
 - 1 – Co-Laborer

 - 3 – Core Team that supplies strength, encouragement, and the foundation to expand influence.

 - 12 – Core Building Team that gives strategic power to calling and anointing.

 - 72 – Core Building Organization that gives spiritual coverage to a sphere of influence.

- Apostle Paul’s Testimony
 - **2 Corinthians 10:13–18 (ESV)** — ¹³ But we will not boast beyond limits, but will boast only with regard to the **area of influence** God assigned to us, to reach even to you. ¹⁴ For we are not overextending ourselves, as though we did not reach you. For we were the first to come all the way to you with the gospel of Christ. ¹⁵ We do not boast beyond limit in the labors of others. But our hope is that as your faith increases, our area of influence among you may be greatly enlarged, ¹⁶ so that we may preach the gospel in lands beyond you, without boasting of work already done in another’s area of influence. ¹⁷ “Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord.” ¹⁸ For it is not the one who commends himself who is approved, but the one whom the Lord commends.

 - **“area of influence”**
 - metron = measure
 - kanon = area, sphere, territory

 - *“Metron is the assigned scope of ministry grace and ministry influence with the limits of appointed lines drawn by God.”* (Frank Damazio, Taking Your Church to the Next Level)

 - *“Metron is our spiritual jurisdiction given to us by God, which are places of authority, action, influence, responsibility and ownership.”* (Frank Damazio, Taking Your Church to the Next Level)
